


TEACHING NOTES: BOBBY'S CASTLE




ABOUT THE SERIES


ABOUT THE ILLUSTRATOR

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
EDUCATIONAL APPLICABILITY

Bobby's Castle is a playful story about a fish called Bobby who decides he doesn't want to play with other fish. But can he change and see things from a different perspective? This book opens up discussions about change and acceptance. Change can bring challenges and upheaval, but with patience and kindness, it can also bring friendship and adventure.

DISCUSSION TOPICS


Read the book together, asking questions throughout.

1. Look at the cover of the book together. What do you think the story might be about?
2. When Salma arrives, Bobby doesn't want to play with her. In fact, he wants her to go away. Ask the children if they've ever felt like this with newcomers?
3. When does Bobby decide that he wants to play? Salma's persistence eventually made Bobby start playing (even though he is reluctant at first).
4. How does Bobby feel now that he's playing with Salma? Did he think he would feel like this at the beginning of the story?
5. What other games could Salma and Bobby play?
6. Talk about change (school, friends, family, events ...) with the class. Some people find change difficult to embrace and others find it easy. Changes happen whether we like it or not and it's how we react to the change that's important.
7. How does the story end? Is Bobby happy?
8. Ask if the children think that *Bobby's Castle* is a good title for the book. What other titles can they think of?
9. What did the children think of the book? If they liked it, why did they like it? What was their favourite part?




FRIENDSHIP POEM



